Meet Ace, Candie, Lily, and Cooper.












These pups specifically have eye conditions that require daily medication. Medication and visits to the vet and specialists can be expensive. BROC spends hundreds of dollars a month just on eye meds alone. But we think you will agree it is worth it to provide quality of life for these cuties who otherwise are generally happy little pups.

ACE



Ace has been with BROC since 2019. He lives with his Forever Foster Family who make sure he gets all the love and attention he can handle. Ace's medical conditions include seizure disorder, heart disease, liver disease, indolent ulceration, and intraocular hypertension in the right eye – all requiring multiple prescriptions daily.

CANDIE



Candie is a long-time resident with BROC. She has been with us since 2017. She has an auto-immune condition that requires constant care and dedication to control. In addition, her medical conditions include mature cataracts, lens-induced uveitis, and keratoconjunctivitis sicca (KCS) in both eyes; intraocular hypertension in her left eye. KCS is a chronic dry eye condition that can be irritating and sometimes painful if left untreated. It can also impair vision. Her Foster Momma provides excellent care and makes sure Candie gets three daily eye drop prescriptions to keep her comfortable and healthy.

LILY



Lily is an exceptional 17-year-old perfect princess. Yes, you read that correctly. She is 17 and still enjoying every single day. Lily was successfully adopted but was returned to BROC in 2020 when her adoptive momma passed away. We are honored to care for her for the rest of her life. She is hearing and sight-impaired and requires medication for her eyes as well as other conditions.

COOPER



Cooper is a handsome, male Westiepoo who lost two separate owners to death before he joined BROC. He presented in perfect health until his left eye became red and irritated, causing him to keep his eye closed. Within a few days, we had to rush him in for treatment. In his left eye, he suffered an anterior lens luxation, collapsed anterior chamber, and endothelial decompensation. He was also diagnosed with chronic uveitis in both eyes, and posterior synechiae on the right. He has two daily prescription eye drops for his left eye and one for his right eye.
